By now you should have received a letter explaining the new water meter installations. On May 28th, meter installers from Saks Meters will go door-to-door, setting up appointments for the installation. If no one is home, they will leave a door hanger explaining how to make the installation appointment. The actual meter installations will start around June 1, 2015. If you did not receive a letter, please call Greg or Tristan at the Wastewater Facility at 454-7173. If you get the voice mail, tell them you want a letter sent to: your name, address, and phone number in case they need to contact you.

The installations will include a new meter and reader pad with wiring if needed; a pressure regulator; dual check valve; shut off; and pressure tank. This is all part of the installation, and will not be charged to the homeowner. We obtained a grant to cover this project.

These meters are not the smart meters used by some utilities, but are a step up from the existing meters. A reader pad will be installed on the outside of most buildings, replacing the old ones, and a handheld device will be used to obtain the reading.

Once all the old meters in town have been replaced, we will continue to bill at the current rate for approximately 2 years. This is to give us the information we need to establish a base line. At that time, we plan to hold a meeting to get feedback from the water system users on the rate restructure.

This is exciting, and a project we have been looking forward to for a long time. The rate restructuring, will finally offer an incentive to conserve water, which many of you have been asking us to provide.
