Notice to voters for Town of Plainfield

BEFORE ELECTION DAY:

CHECKLIST POSTED at Clerk's Office by **January 31, 2024**. If your name is not on the checklist, then you must register to vote. **Sample ballots** will be posted by February 25, 2024.

HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE There is no deadline to register to vote. Plainfield citizens can register prior to voting Day by visiting the Town Clerk's office, or by going online to olvr.vermont.gov **Voters can also register to vote at the polling place.**

REQUEST EARLY or ABSENTEE BALLOTS: You or a family member can request early or absentee ballots at any time during the year of the election in person, in writing, by telephone email, or online at mvp.sec.state.vt.us. **The latest you can request ballots is 12 noon at the Town Clerk's office Monday, March 4, 2024. (If you authorize another person who is not a family to request an absentee ballot for you, that person must make a written application for an absentee ballot for you.)**

WAYS TO VOTE YOUR EARLY BALLOT:

- You may vote in the Town Clerk's office, by appointment only, before the deadline.

- Voters may take his or her ballots out of the Clerk's office and return in the same manner as if the ballots were received by mail.
- Have a ballot mailed to you, and mail or deliver it back to the clerk's office before March 4 or bring it to the polling place before 7:00 p.m. on Voting Day.
If you are sick or disabled before voting day, ask the town clerk to have two justices of the peace bring a ballot to you at your home. (Ballots can be delivered on any of the eight days preceding the day of the election or on the day of election.)
